The target occupation list was created using SOCRATES and adjusted by Board members based on their understanding of local economic conditions in the region. The occupational evaluation report was considered in determining the final list. Key elements for consideration were a wage of no less than \$9 per hour, training time within the Board's ability to provide training, occupations which provided transferrable skills that are in demand in multiple industries, the ability to provide career ladder or career lattice opportunities to trainees, and ten or more openings per year. Several occupations identified require a bachelor's degree. The Board has determined that for these occupations WIA funds may be used to fund the final two years of training prior to obtaining a degree.
